ALL A New Dean for Edinburgh

Revd Canon Frances Burberry succeeds the Revd Susan Macdonald as the new Dean of Edinburgh Diocese.

The new Dean of the Diocese of Edinburgh is to be the Revd Canon Frances Burberry. She will continue as Rector of St Ninian's, Comely Bank but will relinquish her role as Synod Clerk to the diocese, to which she was elected in 2016. The Rt Revd Dr John Armes, Bishop of Edinburgh, speaking



about the appointment, said: 'The role of Dean is a challenging one. I believe that Frances has gifts and experience that will be of great service to our diocese,' he said. 'Last year her clergy colleagues showed their confidence in her by electing her Synod Clerk. She now moves from being the senior elected priest in the diocese to being the senior appointed priest. She will continue to be the Rector of a busy congregation whilst also becoming a key member of our diocesan leadership team.'

Commenting on her appointment, Canon Burberry said,

'It's an enormous honour to have been invited by Bishop John to be Dean of the Diocese of Edinburgh. I've been truly humbled by the warmth of support and encouragement I've received during my time as Synod Clerk; and by the confidence and trust that Bishop John and others have placed in me. I'm very much looking forward to working alongside Bishop John, and with people throughout the Diocese as we participate in God's mission and face future changes and challenges together, and to continuing in my role as Rector of St Ninian's, Comely Bank.'

Canon Burberry will be installed as Dean at a ceremony at **3.30pm on 5**th **March** at St Mary's Cathedral, Palmerston Place at Choral Evensong.

TREASUERS

Allchurches Trust Limited: Roof Protection Scheme grants

This is a special scheme, which we established this year for churches who face a particularly high risk of metal theft. This scheme was initially by invitation only and was towards the cost of an alarm/protection system approved by their insurer



(whoever that may be), but requiring a commitment by the vestry to maintain the system for a minimum of five years.

Allchurches Trust has opened the scheme more widely to any church wishing to apply for a grant through it. The conditions remain the same. However, the grant potentially available to any churches not on our original 'at particularly high risk' list is for the lesser amount of £1000.

Though there has already been an encouraging take-up of grants available under this scheme, we are writing to you now to highlight its wider availability, and to advise you that the closing date for receipt of applications has, for the time being, been extended to 31st March 2017, though this will be kept under review in the light of take-up and available funds. Churches wishing to know more can access further information and a downloadable simple application form on a dedicated page on our website: http://www.allchurches.co.uk/news/roof-protection-scheme. Completed applications, and any queries, should be sent to the dedicated e-mail address for the scheme: rps@allchurches.co.uk, and we would urge any parishes wishing to apply for a grant to do so as soon as possible. We aim to give a response to all applications within one month of receipt, and would normally expect works funded with the help of a grant under this scheme to be completed by 31st December 2017, though in exceptional circumstances we may agree to an extension to this.

CHAPLAINS NEEDED - Edinburgh Sheriff Court

The Listening Service is a new multi-faith chaplaincy at Edinburgh Sheriff Court and Justice of the Peace Court. Courts can be very difficult and confusing places for anyone who uses them and this new service, launched in December 2016 and developed with the Edinburgh Inter-Faith Association, offers a non-judgemental listening ear for people of all faiths and none.

The service was launched with a team of 19 chaplains and this team is planned to be expanded in the New Year. Could you be a chaplain? If so, please register your interest by the end of January 2017.



Voluntary chaplains will come from many backgrounds and do not need any previous experience of this sort of work.

They do need to be:

- willing to talk with and listen to people who are under stress or feeling confused and vulnerable.
- be aware of the need for confidentiality
- broad minded and non-judgmental
- caring and patient
- sympathetic to people in difficult circumstances
- friendly and supportive
- available for at least half a day (4 hours) each fortnight (preferably weekly)

There are no age or gender restrictions and interest is welcomed from people of all faiths and none. Full training will be given and chaplains will be supported and supervised in their work. Initial training will be undertaken over two full days. References will be required and volunteers will be required to complete a Basic Disclosure (on-line) at Disclosure Scotland.





The project is to make kits and send them, through personal contacts, to schools in parts of the world

Film Screening and Seminar The immanence of belief: presencing world and being through Faith Talk by artist filmmaker and scholar Isabel Rocamora



Open to the public - Chaired by Professor Jolyon Mitchell

Described by *The Times* as "complex, beautiful, revelatory", *Faith* is a triptych that intimately observes the act of worship of the three religions of Jerusalem. The film is set in the wilderness of the Judean desert, where, far from the built and contested territories, an Orthodox Jew, a Greek Orthodox Christian and a Sunni Muslim perform their morning prayers. Questioning segregation while celebrating difference, *Faith* contemplates issues of human belief, inviting reflection on one of the most tragic, world resonating conflicts that persist in this new century. Following the screening, Isabel Rocamora will reflect on the thematic intentions and making of her project through a discussion of philosophies which accompany her conceptual process. The issues of imaging, belief as existential mood, and otherness will be considered in dialogue with Jean-Luc Marion's thoughts on the religious icon, Martin Heidegger's early ontology and the ethics of alterity as defined by Emmanuel Levinas.
