
Brilliant Banner Competition

COLOUR - make it bright and beautiful!

TREASURERS & VESTRIES	<p>TARGETED REGULATION FOR SCOTTISH CHARITIES Treasurers and Vestries may wish to be aware that OSCR has this month introduced a new reporting regime. When you file your trustees report, accounts and annual return with OSCR you will now be asked a new series of questions relating to the management of your organisation. In addition, if your annual income is £25,000 or more, a full copy of your trustees report and accounts will be published on the OSCR website. Charity accounts have always been public documents, available on request to anyone who asks, but it will now be much easier for members of the public and others to obtain a copy of your report and accounts. From time to time we read remarks in trustee reports and accounts, usually addressed to congregation members, that vestries may not wish to reach a wider audience. Vestries may in future wish to bear in mind that everything written in their report and accounts can now be read by anyone who chooses to do so. This may include members of the public, and organisations with whom a vestry conducts business. ALL	<p>Think, Pray, Vote: EU Referendum resources for churches The Church in Society Committee of the Scottish Episcopal Church commends the resources <i>Think, Pray, Vote</i> produced by the Joint Public Issues Team (Baptist Church, Church of Scotland, Methodist Church, United Reformed Church) with the support of the Scottish Churches' Parliamentary Office (SCPO). <i>Think, Pray, Vote</i> has been prepared to enable Christians to reflect thoughtfully and prayerfully on the issues involved and can be used for conversations with groups or for personal reflection. It explores issues that surround the referendum, such as sovereignty, the single market, freedom of movement and the environment. 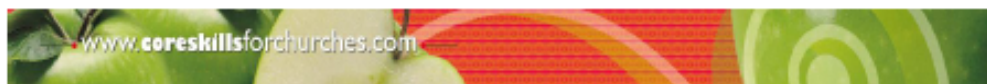

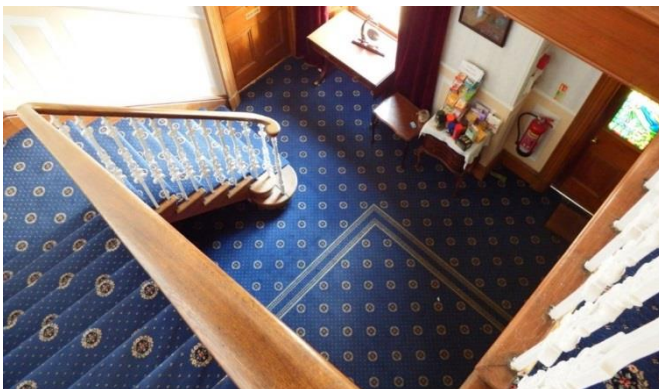

The Psalms – The Prayer Book of Israel

An Adventures in Faith theology presentation

Saturday 28 May 2pm - 4pm

The Trinity Centre, Haddington, East Lothian

With Dr Anja Klein, Chancellor's Fellow in Biblical Studies
(Hebrew Bible), School of Divinity, University of Edinburgh.

The Psalms constitute the core part of the Hebrew Bible. Frequently used in everyday worship, most Christians are familiar at least with the classics such as Ps23 (The Lord is my shepherd) or Ps139 (If I take the wings of the morning). This talk will shed light on the importance of the Psalms as being the prayer book of Israel. As such, the texts show how Israel participated in the worship and culture of its Ancient Near Eastern surroundings, how the identity of the people of the God of Israel was formed, and how the Psalms developed from a collection of prayer into a book of the Hebrew Bible. Depending on the audience's interest, there will be plenty of room for questions and discussion.

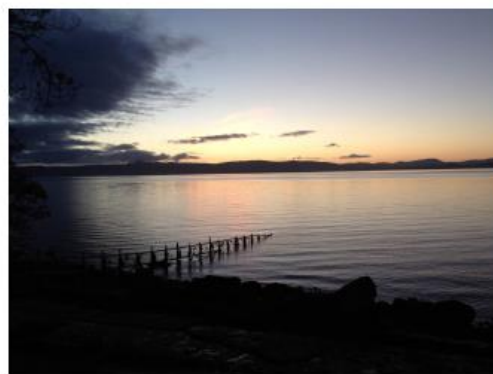




UPDATE – MAY 2016



How is the project doing?

As with any new project there has been masses of hard slog in the background. Lots of progress has been made.

Here's what's been happening:

A freelance project worker was appointed thanks to funding from the Methodist District Advance Fund. She has been able to nurture a positive working relationship with the senior manager at the Sheriff Court.

A formal proposal and outline of the project has been accepted by the Sheriff Principal. This was a vital step and receiving affirmation from such a senior person gives a strong foundation for future development.

A major funding application has been made with a view to recruiting lead chaplains who will develop and supervise a team of volunteer chaplains.

A management group has been formed in association with Edinburgh Inter Faith Association to plan the launch of the project.

A successful fundraising concert 'Multi-cultural cabaret' took place in February.

Further fundraising events: a concert at City of Edinburgh Methodist Church on Saturday May 28th (see over) and a Ceilidh, also at the Methodist Church on Saturday 25th June (details to follow).

There will be 'Information and Taster' events for people interested in becoming voluntary chaplains, on Thursday 25th August between 4.00pm and 8.00pm and Saturday 3rd September from 10.00am until 2.00pm. These will be held at City of Edinburgh Methodist Church.

Thank you for your support – your financial contributions, time and prayer are invaluable.
