Pensions auto-enrolment final staging dates TREASURERS

The final group of Charges had their pensions auto-enrolment staging date on 1 August 2017. Regulator is On that date a pension scheme needed to be in place, and all paid staff needed to be assessed and have received the appropriate letter.

Those earning £833 per month must be enrolled in a pension scheme (which may be the SEC scheme); those earning £490 are entitled to opt-in to a pension scheme with employer contributions; those below may join a scheme but no employer contributions are required. A declaration of compliance then needs to be completed for the Pensions Regulator.




