## Inquisition A New Play by Paul Bentley

Paul Bentley is a British writer and actor. Among his television credits are the High Septon in *Game of Thrones*, and his theatre appearances include Lloyd Webber's *Cats* and *Aspects of Love*, and Sondheim's *Follies* and *Company*.

Dr David Grumett is Senior Lecturer in Theology and Ethics in the University of Edinburgh. His books include *Teilhard de Chardin: Theology, Humanity and Cosmos.* 

In 1925 the controversial Jesuit priest and scientist Pierre Teilhard de Chardin was ordered to sign "The Six Propositions". This Vatican document contained rigidly conservative teachings on original sin and human origins. Until now its content has been secret. The document will be made public for the first time and the issues surrounding it will be presented with interpretation and discussion.

The day will include professional actors performing a staged reading of *Inquisition*, a new play by Paul Bentley which dramatizes Teilhard's dilemma when faced with the Six Propositions: forced to believe in either the Bible or science.



# HOSTING OUR STORY The Travelling Exhibition

The Our Story Project has collected together memories and stories from faith communities in the city of Edinburgh through oral histories and interviews. The project aims to celebrate the city's diversity through the stories of people who live here. Alongside a static exhibition, held at the Museum of Edinburgh until April 2018, we have developed a travelling version of the exhibition which centres around the theme of identity. In 2017 a new project launched to explore the potential for a national accreditation pathway for spiritual directors across England, Scotland and Wales. This may include the development of a new organisation to support best practice for this growing ministry, as well as being of interest and value to those seeking to find a good spiritual director in their area. Whether you offer or receive Spiritual Direction, or are interested in another way, we would love to hear from you - be part of the discussion!

BACKGROUND to the project can be found on this webpage.

On 1st December we launched an <u>ONLINE SURVEY</u> and are delighted in the interest thus far, with a greater and more varied engagement than we had ever anticipated. Views expressed via the survey range from those that are clearly positive about the possibility of an accreditation pathway to those who are strongly against it. There are also those who have named their uncertainty or indicate reservations. Many people (whatever their overall feeling) highlight the need for further information about what accreditation may involve practically, and also how this might sit alongside soulful ministry and charism. We are taking time with our next reflection stage in order to respond to the survey data and questions asked. We will then disseminate more substantive information in due course; to be kept up to date with further news in the coming weeks and months do <u>sign up here</u>.

Meanwhile our ONLINE SURVEY will remain open until 31 MARCH 2018. The survey is for

directors, also for people who are receiving spiritual direction, or anyone else who is interested in this consultation in some other way. It will take around 10 minutes to complete and is anonymous. Do take part!
