Tapio Luoma elected new Archbishop

The Bishop of Espoo, Tapio Luoma, received 56 percent of the votes and will replace the current Archbishop Kari Mäkinen upon his retirement in June.

Bishop Tapio Luoma has been elected the next Archbishop of Finland's Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Luoma, who is currently the Bishop of the diocese of Espoo, received 56 percent of the votes in the second round of the election, thereby beating his contender Björn Vikström, the Bishop of the diocese of Porvoo.

The first round of election took place in February and at that time Luoma and Vikström collected the most votes.

At present, the most contentious issue within the Lutheran church is the question of samesex marriage. While Luoma does not support marrying gay couples in the church, he says he will stand behind any decision that the Church makes in the matter.

Luoma, who is 55, will replace the current archbishop Kari Mäkinen in June when Mäkinen retires.



Spiritual Direction – a Question of Accreditation?

Do you offer, or receive, Spiritual Direction/Accompaniment?

In 2017 a new project launched to explore the potential for a national accreditation pathway for spiritual directors across England, Scotland and Wales. This may include the development of a new organisation to support best practice for this growing ministry, as well as being of interest and value to those seeking to find a good spiritual director in their area. Whether you offer or receive Spiritual Direction, or are interested in another way, we would love to hear from you - be part of the discussion!

BACKGROUND to the project can be found on this webpage.

On 1st December we launched an ONLINE SURVEY and are delighted in the interest thus far, with a greater and more varied engagement than we had ever anticipated. Views expressed via the survey range from those that are clearly positive about the possibility of an accreditation pathway to those who are strongly against it. There are also those who have named their uncertainty or indicate reservations. Many people (whatever their overall feeling) highlight the need for further information about what accreditation may involve practically, and also how this might sit alongside soulful ministry and charism. We are taking time with our next reflection stage in order to respond to the survey data and questions asked. We will then disseminate more substantive information in due course; to be kept up to date with further news in the coming weeks and months do sign up here.

Meanwhile our ONLINE SURVEY will remain open until 31 MARCH 2018. The survey is for

directors, also for people who are receiving spiritual direction, or anyone else who is interested in this consultation in some other way. It will take around 10 minutes to complete and is anonymous. Do take part!

Grace in Early Christianity

A Lenten Series at St Vincent's Chapel



One belief is unique to Christianity: God's unconditional love, known as 'grace'.

Augustine and Pelagius were at fisticuffs over grace in the fifth century. The sixteenth-century western church disintegrated over the meanings of grace with the Reformation. Debates about grace continue today.

We need to recover the meanings of grace in early Christianity to grasp them anew and buttress our appreciation of God's goodness to us in Jesus Christ.

This series looks to early Christianity to ask four questions.

Grace: What's in a word? Thursday 01 March 2018

Grace: What does Paul have to say? Thursday 08 March 2018

Grace: What do other New Testament writers have to say? Thursday 15 March 2018

Grace: What do the early Christian writers have to say? Thursday 22 March 2018

The questions will be presented by the Revd Dr Michael Hull of the Scottish Episcopal Institute and St Vincent's Chapel (hull.michael@icloud.com).

Each session begins promptly at 6.15pm and ends at 7.15pm. Refreshments are served immediately thereafter. Sessions are free and open to the public.

The Holywell Community is a new monastic community based in the thriving market town of Abergavenny. Working with the four diverse Anglican churches in the incumbency, the Community provides an opportunity for young adults exploring their Christian vocation to live, worship and work together for a year at a time.
