News from the Bishop's Enabler of Mission

Remembrance 100, season of prayer for peace and reconciliation

In 1918 on Sunday 4th August (which was the fourth anniversary of the declaration of the First World War) the whole of the United Kingdom held a National Day of Prayer and 100 days later the war ended. So in 2018 all Christians and churches are invited to join in 100 days of prayer for peace and reconciliation in our time, between 4th August and 11th November.


We have plenty of delegate spaces available and grants are also available to help with the cost of attending.




