


Mark Set to Music Sunday 27th January, 6pm; St Columba's by the Castle, Edinburgh

"The Hand of Truth"

A Georgian Mystery by David Paton (aka David Paton-Williams, Rector of St Columba's by the Castle) published by The Book Guild, £9.99 from 28th January

"It's hard being a quack in Georgian England - harder still when your patients are being murdered and their deaths blamed on you.

The year is 1780, war rages in America and, in Amsterdam, a British agent is stabbed to death while investigating a conspiracy.
