To all congregations in the Scottish Episcopal Church

Last year, I wrote to you encouraging congregations to consider supporting the work of Aberlour at Christingle events or other occasions during the period of Advent and Christmas. This letter is to make a similar request this year and comes on behalf of the College of Bishops.

Aberlour itself writes:-

Aberlour is delighted to have received well over £10,000 in donations from the Scottish Episcopal Church community in the past year which has helped us to support children, young people and families all over Scotland. We are truly grateful for the support of the Primus, the College of Bishops and all who have played a part.

But the need continues to grow. This year Aberlour commissioned research which has revealed that young people in Scotland's poorest communities are three times more likely to die before 25 than their peers in richer areas. We need to do more, and we need to reach more children and families, so that we can support them through tough times. Because a bad start shouldn't mean a bad end.

We know that what we do works. We met Morgan several years ago. Her childhood in Govan was tough and when we met her she was at risk of going off the rails and becoming involved in drugs, violence and crime. Over time, we helped her turn her life around – and now Morgan is the first member of her family to go to university. You can watch Morgan talk about her journey at www.aberlour.org.uk/nobadends/.

We know there are thousands more children who can turn their lives around with our support, but to make this happen we need your help.

Many caring people in helping professions are cautious about the idea of power, not wishing to have 'power over' others. Come and join an afternoon affirming positive relationship to role power.

1.30 - 4pm at St Columba's By the Castle, Central Edinburgh - £25

Power is the ability to influence and be influenced by others. Power is relational, and relationships can be messy. Good intentions are essential, but not enough to ensure we use our power well; we make mistakes, or even *under*-use the appropriate power we have to effect change. Most misuses of power happen when those who have influence due to their roles misjudge the impact on others; limited knowledge of power dynamics can leave us adrift. Using material from psychotherapist Dr Cedar Barstow this event explores how we can relate positively to power with reflection, sensitivity and heart, and offer reparation when difficulties occur. For faith leaders, support workers, pastoral carers, counsellors, spiritual accompaniers etc. Suitable as a CPD event, certificates are available on request.

Facilitated by **Elizabeth White**, a spiritual director and senior accredited pastoral supervisor with APSE. Having formerly coordinated the adult learning programme for the Diocese of Edinburgh, she now offers group and individual opportunities for spiritual reflection on life and work. Elizabeth also co-ordinates a project exploring a national accreditation pathway for spiritual directors; supporting best practice, heartening ethics and enlivening accountability.

Murrayfield Churches Together Faith Discussion Group

The Faith Discussion Group considers different topics to do with faith to try better to understand what faith is and how it affects us both as individuals and as a community. All are welcome to our meetings, including doubters and sceptics.

Before Christmas, meetings will be on Tuesday evenings, from 8th October to 26th November in the Upper Room at Saughtonhall United Reformed Church 85/87 Saughtonhall Drive, Edinburgh EH12 5TR.

Last session the group became a book club and spent eight weeks reading through half of the New Testament with lively discussions following the readings each week.

This autumn, we will read the rest of it. *The Community Bible Experience* has taken the New International Version translation of the bible and re-ordered and reformatted it. Since this version also has no chapter or verse numbers, it reads like a normal book. So, having read Luke, Acts, and the Pauline letters, we move on to Matthew's gospel and the rest of the New Testament books.

Reading the Bible a whole book at a time has proved to be an enlightening experience, even for regular bible readers. It is not necessary to have been with us for the first half to join for the second half. Or, if you can't make it on a Tuesday evening, why not travel with us and just follow the readings at home?

We can obtain copies of this edition of the New Testament for you at £5; just let us know. So, if you have always meant to work your way through the New Testament now is your chance. We read around 30 pages per week.






