

- supporting the church's digital communications.



10am-1pm at The Cornerstone Centre, St John's Princes Street, Edinburgh EH2 4BJ

We have now arranged an initial training session, run by Ley-Anne Forsyth, the Youth Officer for the Diocese of Moray, Ross & Caithness, who provides all the Child Protection training for the Leaders of the Glenalmond Provincial Youth Camp.

The aim of this introductory event is to provide you with the basic awareness of how Safeguarding infuses the many aspects of your church life, how to identify areas of concern, and what steps you can take to keep all your congregation safe.
