Diocesan synod – 14th March 2020

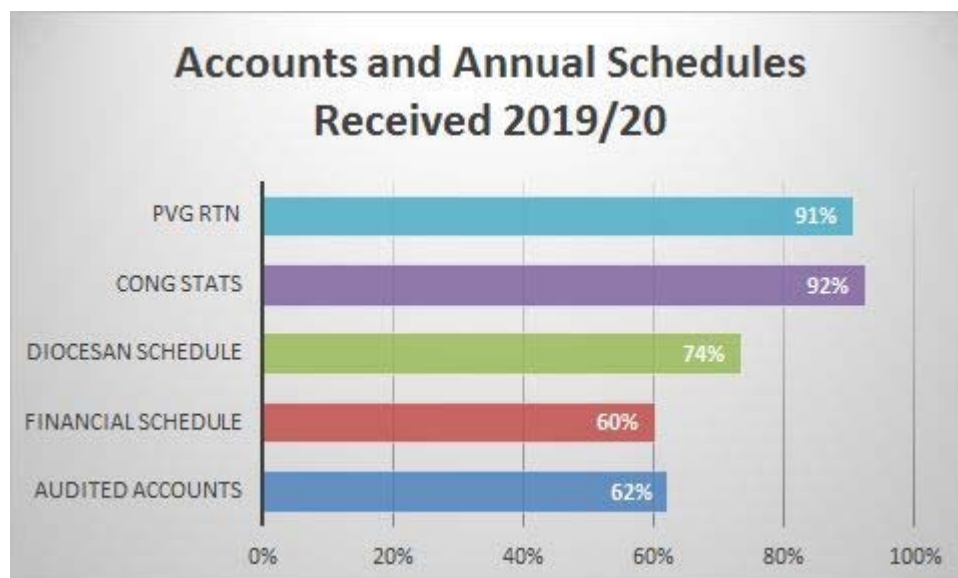
The agenda and papers will be going out as soon as possible after the Standing Committee has met (Thu 6th). These will be posted to all VOTING members. If you are a voting member, and do not



The congregation of St Peter's Lutton Place are feeling grateful and inspired this new year as they complete the second and largest phase of renewing their church hall.


After two and a half years of deliberations, consultations, planning, personal gifts, fundraising events, trust donations, official permissions, architects, quantity surveyors, joiners, glaziers, decorators, engineers and many more people, St Peter's church has been realigned with an airy new link building.

Several charitable trusts have supported the project so far: Viridor Landfill Tax Credits, The Robertson Trust, Allchurches Trust, The Baird Trust and Swinton Paterson Trust. The Provincial Buildings Fund and National Lottery have confirmed their commitment to Phase Three of the project.

Individual members of the congregation have supported this new lease of life for St Peter's buildings with personal gifts. The church held fundraising concerts, coffee mornings and quiz evenings for the cause. More are in the pipeline for 2020.

'Right Use of Power' Workshop



Responding to interest, this is a re-run of a workshop first held in November 2019

Power is the ability to influence and be influenced by others. Power is relational, and relationships can be messy. Good intentions are essential, but not enough to ensure we use our power well; we make mistakes, or even *under-use* the appropriate power we have to effect change. Most misuses of power happen when those who have influence due to their roles misjudge the impact on others; limited knowledge of power dynamics can leave us adrift. This event explores how we can relate positively to power with reflection, sensitivity and heart, and offer reparation when difficulties occur. For faith leaders, pastoral teams, teachers, counsellors, spiritual companions etc.

Elizabeth White is a spiritual director and senior accredited pastoral supervisor. Having formerly co-ordinated the adult learning programme for the Diocese of Edinburgh, she now offers group and individual opportunities for spiritual reflection on life and work.

What is spiritual abuse?

What are the key characteristics that lie behind this difficult label?
And what impact does the experience of spiritual abuse have on people's lives?

Through input from current research, small group discussion and plenary, this workshop will help 'soul care practitioners' to consider the definitions and implications of these questions for their work. Brief pointers may be given for accompanying those who have experienced abuse, but the main emphasis will be on what we need to be aware of as we hold safe, sacred space for others. This event is open to faith leaders, spiritual directors, and therapists etc, particularly those working in 1:1 or small group settings. Suitable as a CPD event, certificates are available on request.



Facilitator, Anne Solomon is an experienced spiritual director and supervisor working in Cheltenham. Ways of Praying Course

21st May to 18th June 2020
