



To what extent is the Bible a historical document?

If people and events are not historical what are they?

The **historicity of the Bible** is the question of the Bible's "acceptability as a history". Is the Christian New Testament an accurate record of the historical Jesus and the Apostolic Age?

Power is the ability to influence and be influenced by others. Power is relational, and relationships can be messy.
