Easter Anthems

Christ our passover has been sacrificed for us: so let
celebrate the feast.

Not with the old leaven of corruption and wickedness: but
with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Christ once raised from the dead, dies no more: death has
no more dominion over him.

In dying he died for sin, once and for all: in living he lives
to God.

See yourselves therefore dead to sin: and alive to God in
Jesus Christ our Lord.

Christ has been raised from the dead: the first fruits of
those who sleep.

For as by humanity came death: from humanity has come
also the resurrection of the dead.

For as in Adam all die: even so in Christ shall all be made
alive.

Lighting your own Paschal Candle

It has long been the tradition of the Church to light a Paschal Candle at Easter. The lighting of the candle symbolises Christ's Passover from death to life. In lighting this candle and in our prayers today we honour the memory of his death and resurrection. In hearing the Gospel proclaimed and in celebrating the Sacrament of the Eucharist we can be assured that we too share in Christ's victory over death and that we live with him for ever in God. Please light a fresh candle in your home to represent the Paschal Candle which will be lit in the church.

As you light your candle pray:



Father, we share in the light of your glory
Through your Son, the light of the world.
Make this new candle + holy, and inflame
us with new hope. Purify our minds by this
Easter celebration, and bring us one day
to the eternal light. We ask this through
Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

COMMITMENT TO CHRISTIAN LIFE


As a disciple of Christ will you continue in the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? ***With the help of God, I will.***
