Diocesan Synod - UPDATE

All Synod members should now have received the Synod agenda, nom ination form and the vacancies needing to be filled. The Annual Reports and other papers will be issued in the next week or so. The deadline for nominations is **MIDDAY on MONDAY I**st **MARCH**. Voting will open on 3rd March and details will be sent out/uploaded very soon. The agenda and the other papers can be found here:

The Synod Eucharist will be streamed on Zoom from St Mary's Cathedral, led by the Provost and Vice Provost. Just to re-confirm the details published last week:

- The meeting will use the Zoom software, in the same way as used for General Synod last year
- The Bishop, Dean and Diocesan Secretary will chair the meeting as normal, probably from a common location, but safely distanced
- We have planned a number of breaks within the meeting, to break up looking at a screen for a long period of time
- Papers and documents will be uploaded to the webpage (above)

We have engaged Sanctus Media to help us host the meeting online. Sanctus Media were responsible

The (online) Synod Eucharist will be streamed from St Mary's Cathedral

for hosting the General Synod last year, and they also handle all the technical aspects for the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

We are aware that some people may be daunted by using Zoom, so we will provide some online resources in advance and brief training at the start of the meeting on how to vote on the usual Motions and how to ask to speak etc. There also will be a live stream on our website. Although that live stream will not allow any interaction with the meeting, it will be an easy way for anyone to see and hear the proceedings. This will never be ideal, but I am sure nearly all of you have faced the same challenges with your vestry meetings and AGMs. We want to do all we can to make sure that no Synod members feel excluded.

Purpose

Grants are to support the heritage sector to strengthen its recovery from the coronavirus (COVID-19) in the medium term and to build back for positive change across the UK's heritage. The scheme supports a broad range of heritage projects and activities.

Size of grants

Three levels of grants are available:

- from £3,000 to £10,000
- from £10,000 to £250,000
- from £250,000 to £5 million

PRINCES STREET EASTER PLAY

The Princes Street Easter Play project is happening this April! The Glastonbury Festival may have been cancelled. Even the Tokyo Olympics is in doubt. It looks certain that a live performance in Princes Street Gardens is not feasible, so the Play will be going digital, like many other theatre productions.

Easter Weekend this year is in early April (2nd-4th) and we're going to make an audio recording of the play "**Saturday**", which we had to cancel last year. It's a completely new script, which explores what the disciples of Jesus were feeling and doing as well as the dangers they faced, during the Saturday between Jesus' Crucifixion on Good Friday and his Resurrection on Easter Sunday. It includes a number of scenes from the Gospel stories as the disciples remember their Master's life and actions.

We are also planning to make **video recordings of several one-person scenes**, featuring characters we know from the Gospels, such as the healed leper, Pilate's wife and the Centurion at the Cross. Sam Rowe, our new actor playing the part of Jesus will be with us and we look forward to a great performance from him.

The production will be available on our website, www.easterplay.org (this is currently being redesigned, but the address will remain the same). It will also be extensively promoted on social media. More details will be available soon.

Please pray for the actors, our director Suzanne Lofthus and the trustees as we firm up plans and press ahead in hope and faith. Your interest is much appreciated and we hope that you'll be able to encourage your people to watch, listen and be enriched in this way.

FROM THE BISHOP

BISHOP'S LENT APPEAL 2021

Like so much else, our Lent Appeal this year must take account of the pandemic.

Many congregations are responding generously to local need, such as foodbanks and support services for the lonely and the anxious and I hope this will continue into Lent and beyond. My concern is that this focus on the local and personal, on simply getting through the crisis, takes our attention away from pressing needs in other parts of the world, where there is no NHS, no benefits safety-net and where life is constrained by poverty. Hence my proposal that this year we support a single, outward-looking cause.

The **Together in Unity Appeal** was set up by the Archbishop of Canterbury to support virus prevention and emergency relief for vulnerable communities across the Anglican Communion. At a time when the UK government has, disappointingly, decided to cut international aid this provides an opportunity for us to reach out in solidarity to our sisters and brothers, our neighbours in this small world, whom Jesus calls us to love as we love ourselves.

I know there is less money around this year but I would ask you to be generous. Perhaps we might see our giving as an expression of gratitude for the blessings that we so easily take for granted.

The Anglican Communion Fund has already begun responding to COVID related needs, allocating over £180,000 across 21 provinces of the Communion. We are supporting the Church in its ministry, providing food relief to the vulnerable, communicating ways of staying safe from the virus, and providing

handwashing facilities and PPE. In the South Sudanese Diocese of Maridi, an ACF grant provided food items, soaps and seeds to over 200 pastors and lay-readers provided bicycles microphones for pastors carry prevention messages remote into areas. Speaking of the support, Bishop Moses Zungo said, "You held our hand during our most trying moments."

'Questions of our Times' is presented by the Christian Evidence Society, which exists to make the case for faith in the modern world. The evening webinars will be hosted by the society's vice-chair and former editor of The Salvation Army's weekly magazine, *The War Cry*, Major Nigel Bovey.

'The Christian Evidence Society is an inter-denominational Christian trust that promotes the evidence for the credibility of Christianity,' says the society's chair, the Revd Canon Edward Carter. 'With the coronavirus having such a huge effect, I hope this timely series of topical conversations will help people consider some of the fundamental questions of our times.'

The webinars mark the 150th anniversary of the society, which was founded in 1870 with a public lecture series, responding to the challenges of the times. This 2021 series has been made possible with the support of the Montgomery Trust.
