Over the past few weeks, the Diocesan Office has been trialling its brandnew online help and discussion portal for vestries, which will launch in January.


After receiving useful feedback from several willing test pilots, links for the Diocesan Online Support Forum will be published in the next edition of *The Communicant*.



NEW SEC ADVISORY GROUP COVID-19 GUIDANCE

Below is the SEC AG's latest guidance message, which was sent by email to all clergy, lay readers, vestry secretaries and diocesan secretaries on Wednesday, 15 December.

"The Advisory Group has noted the announcement made yesterday by the First Minister following concerns over the Omicron variant.

We have been pressing the Scottish Government for clarity on the full implications for Places of Worship arising from the updating of measures aimed at reducing virus transmission. For confirmation, the new Government guidance will not ask Places of Worship to close.

We understand from the Scottish Government that they will re-issue their Places of Worship guidance during the course of tomorrow and the Advisory Group itself will issue a further update as soon as possible after that information becomes available."

Below is the SEC AG's second-last guidance message, which was sent by email to all clergy, lay readers, vestry secretaries and diocesan secretaries on Friday, 10 December.

"The Advisory Group met recently and provides the following update. There are no significant changes being made at this time but we draw the following to your attention:

- I. As yet, while data on the Omicron variant are collected and assessed, the implications of the variant remain uncertain. Government is not tightening restrictions at this point but is strengthening its emphasis on compliance with the basic measures we are all already familiar with:
 - the importance of being vaccinated and receiving the booster dose as soon as one is eligible
 - following the "baseline" measures (the wearing of face coverings, encouraging good ventilation and good hygiene)

- the taking of lateral flow tests when meeting others, in whatever context. The Advisory Group has previously endorsed earlier Government guidance to take lateral flow tests twice weekly. Given the Government's recent request to take lateral flow tests more frequently, the Advisory Group encourages people to take such tests before attending church services and, if testing positive, not to attend.
- 2. The Government has made some minor changes to its own Places of Worship guidance including some FAQs about Christmas. That revised guidance is available at: https://www.gov.scot/publications/coronavirus-covid-19-phase-3-guidance-for-the-safe-use-of-places-of-worship/
- 3. During Advent and Christmastide many churches will be holding services with little interval in between perhaps particularly over Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Churches are reminded of the need to clean/sanitise between services including regular cleaning of touch points such as light switches, pews, toilets, door handles etc.
- 4. Face coverings remain mandatory for those aged 12 and over, unless an exemption applies. The Advisory Group has received some anecdotal evidence of occasional difficulty being experienced in ensuring that those attending weddings wear face coverings. It therefore re-emphasises that the wearing of face coverings is a legal requirement for all services in church, including weddings and funerals. There is a specific exemption in relation to weddings but it is limited to the parties being married (where there is at least one metre, or a partition, between those parties and anyone else), to the person leading the service (again, provided there is at least one metre distance or a partition) and to any person accompanying one of the prospective spouses as part of the ceremony (e.g. to walk down the aisle).

Since preparing the above update the First Minister has today reported on the Government's concerns about the Omicron variant. No new measures for places of worship are being introduced at present, albeit Christmas work parties are being discouraged and the rules on self-isolation for household contacts are being made more stringent, but if the situation changes in the coming days and new restrictions are introduced, we will issue a further update.





LIVINGSTONE INITIATIVE EIGHT YEARS ON

The Diocesan Office received this message from The Livingstone Initiative, regarding one of the charity's projects that was supported in the 2013 Diocesan Lent Appeal. Anyone interested in following up this communication or in making a further donation should contact Belinda Hodge directly, using the details at the bottom of this page.



"As you may recall the Diocese of Edinburgh very kindly supported The Livingstone Initiative when we were marking the Bicentenary of the birth of David Livingstone back in 2013. We are now pleased to report substantial progress on the school, which is being built by the community in Chama, and with a variety of other projects, as set out on the accompanying document.

We also attach a short drone video of the new school roof and we have updated the main video about the vision for the school. Links to both these videos are attached below and within the document.

As you will see from the document, we are close to being able to open St Mary's Anglican Secondary School for Girls in Chama, north-eastern Zambia. The construction of the school is taking time, but this is because the community themselves are building it and because of the annual rains, they are restricted to six months dry season a year. The Pandemic, too, has hindered work, but we are getting there.

We are now launching a new appeal - Fitting Out the Classroom Block - as we need to raise some further funds to finish the initial works. We calculate we need to raise a further £21,000 to fund the following:

Installation of 17 Door frames + doors; 41 window frames + windows, burglar bars and door gate grills, hard-wearing flooring, ceilings and interior decoration for the classroom block, desks and chairs.

Funding for expert advice on practicalities and agriculture at the school

Administrative expenses for securing partners and funding, project management and administration.

Some additional funding is being raised in Zambia and the Zambian Government will be supplying all the teachers and paying their salaries and accommodation and supplying textbooks.

We remain very grateful to you and the Diocese for the generous support you have given, but I am wondering if there is a chance that the Diocese might consider further help, so that we can get the school open.

I would be very happy to answer any questions you may have and I hope to hear back from you."
