

END THE WAR IN UKRAINE - NATIONAL MARCH AND RALLY - SUNDAY 5th JUNE



We are inviting you to join our Rally to mark 100 days since the illegal invasion of Ukraine on Sunday the 5th of June from 12pm.

Since the Russian Invasion on the 24th of February thousands of people have died or been wounded and millions of Ukrainians have been displaced in the largest refugee crisis since the second world war. Many Ukrainians have now arrived in Scotland.

The economic impacts of this war are reverberating around the world causing fuel and food prices to spiral and leading to an economic crisis in the UK and globally.

The war must end. We invite you to join us at the National March and Rally where we will be marching through Edinburgh and having speakers, music, and prayers for Ukraine.
