Trauma Teddies

Some of you will know that there are a number of Welcome Hubs in Scotland for people fleeing the conflict in Ukraine. Under the Scottish Government's Super Sponsor Scheme, people do not need to



know where they are going to stay before they travel, and so the Welcome Hubs are providing a vital service in providing immediate access to accommodation when people arrive as well as other support and access to services. Esther Elliott from St Mary's Cathedral, in her role as Airport Chaplain, is involved with the Welcome Hub to the West of Edinburgh. The staff there have been giving out knitted "trauma teddies" to the children that have been arriving. Trauma teddies have been used for some time by the Police, the Red Cross, hospitals and other emergency response agencies as a way of providing comfort for children experiencing distressing and difficult situations. The Welcome Hub however has run out! Esther is therefore looking for monetary donations to buy some good quality teddies, all wearing a little welcome t-shirt, to give to the children at the Hub.


