





INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR BISHOP'S LENT APPEAL 2023

The Bishop of Edinburgh is inviting bids and nominations from people across the Diocese for what could be the focus of the Bishop's Lent Appeal in 2023.

Bishop John Armes sponsors a Lent Appeal each year with the funds raised shared equally between two charitable organisations. One at home within Edinburgh Diocese and the UK and one elsewhere in the world.

Over the past few years we have contributed to a wide variety of projects such as sewing machines in Papua New Guinea, the work of IJM, and of the Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme in Palestine and Israel.

In our home diocese we have supported Waverley Care and Faith in Older People and St John and recently Fresh Start Borders, helping families move from homelessness to permanent tenancies.

Churches and Historic Buildings: Bats

For information

The Lord Bishop of St Albans <u>asked</u> His Majesty's Government "how many (1) church buildings, and (2) other historical buildings, in the UK are adversely affected by the presence of bat roosts."

In response, the new Minister for Civil Society, Lord Kamall, said that "[data from partner bodies] highlighted that around 60% of pre-16th century churches contain bat roosts, many home to nationally important breeding colonies. Churches are known to house larger roosts than other, natural sites. Of 120 churches with bats consulted by the project partnership, for the 2015 project questionnaire, 90 churches reported damage caused by bats to the fabric of the church building, 81 churches reported damage to more than one monument, and 97 churches reported damage to fixtures and fittings."

Government outlines plans to help cut energy bills for businesses

For information

BEIS has announced that through the <u>Energy Bill Relief Scheme</u>, the Government will provide a discount on wholesale gas and electricity prices for all non-domestic customers (including all UK businesses, the voluntary sector like charities and the public sector such as schools and hospitals) whose current gas and electricity prices have been significantly inflated in light of global energy prices. This support will be equivalent to the <u>Energy Price Guarantee</u> put in place for households.

It will apply to fixed contracts agreed on or after 1 April 2022, as well as to deemed, variable and flexible tariffs and contracts. It will apply to energy usage from 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023, running for an initial six-month period for all non-domestic energy users. The savings will be first seen in October bills, which are typically received in November. Customers do not need to take action or apply to the scheme to access the support. Support (in the form of a p/kWh discount) will automatically be applied to bills. The level of price reduction for each business will vary depending on their contract type and circumstances (see here).

Living Well with Differences is an online course designed for church leaders who would like to better equipped to recognise and respond well to differences, change and conflict in our churches. It provides an introduction to the dynamics of conflict in ourselves and in faith communities and provides tools for positively addressing conflict and helping create a safer environment for all.

What will be involved?

Participants will be required to participate in 4 online sessions on a weekly basis over the course of a month. Each participant will receive a workbook that contains the content covered, as well as reflective tasks that can be completed between sessions. Each participant will receive a certificate on completion of the course.

Who will facilitate the training?

The course will be facilitated by two Place for Hope facilitators experienced in training others in conflict transformation and mediation.

What will the course include?

- Understanding conflict: We will share what we mean by conflict, and how
 it 'looks' in our churches; we will also begin to explore our different approaches
 to conflict, and how we respond.
- 2. Conflict transformation skills: Working with real life scenarios, we will explore how conflict escalates. In doing so, we will consider tools and techniques to 'lower' the level of conflict, enabling us to work constructively with disagreements in different settings.
- 3. Responding to Bullying & Harrassment: We will explore how we can respond with dignity and respect as our core values to bullying and harassing behaviour in our church communities.
- 4. SEC Context: We will look at the internal policies and mechanisms in the Scottish Episcopal Church for handling conflict-related complaints.
- **5. Additional Resources:** Further links and a reading list will be provided For further exploration of the topics covered in the course.




