

General Synod

The General Synod of the Scottish Episcopal Church took place last week between 8 and 10 June, and we're grateful to all in and beyond our diocese who offered their time, wisdom, words and prayers.

Among the items discussed were the Scottish Episcopal Church's Net Zero Action Plan, which was given backing from Synod; the issues and challenges facing young people in the SEC; and the opportunities in ecumenical partnerships, with the fist ever address to an an SEC Synod from a serving Church of Scotland Moderator. The Moderator, the Rt Rev Sally Foster-Fulton, expressed her joy to be working with the SEC, especially in light of the 2021 St Andrew's Agreement.



Rev'd Canon William (Bill) Brockie

It is with sadness we note that the Rev'd Canon William (Bill) James Thomson Brockie passed away on 11 June 2023. Bill served in this diocese for many years, starting as Team Priest at St John the Evangelist, Princes Street, and serving as the Anglican Chaplain to students in Edinburgh. From 1976 - 2000 he was the Rector at St Martin of Tours, as well as Priest in Charge at the (now closed) St Luke's Congregation in Wester Hailes & Baberton between 1979 and 1990. He was made an honorary Canon of St Mary's Cathedral in 1997. Details of Bill's funeral will be publicised when known, though this may take place before the publication of the next Communicant, and therefore may be publicised via online channels only. P.3
