This month the church celebrates Creationtide. This Season of Creation is dedicated to God, the creator and sustainer of all life and this year the theme is 'Let Justice and Peace Flow' . Does your church have an Eco-Group? How have you been marking the season? We'd love to hear from you and have you share your photos.

St Martin of Tours' has been marking the season with an exhibition of work by local artists - including some from Garvald, a local charity which supports people with neuro-diversity.
