Each one tells the story of the first Christmas from a different perspective, using well-known nursery rhyme tunes to bring the storyline to life.”</p> <p>Three scripts: Old Uncle Sam; Completing the Crib; The Christmas Three, each with a script, songs, music scores and craft templates.</p>
	<p><i>Not Another Carol Service</i> Susan Sayer, illustr. Jennifer Carter (Kevin Mayhew, 1996)</p>	<p>“Alternative Christmas Workshops for All-Age Outreach. ...a set of afternoon workshops which culminate in a presentation and service lasting no more than half an hour and suitable for all ages.”</p> <p>Four scripts: The Bethlehem Herald; Starbirth; The Christmas Present; The Time Machine.</p>
	<p><i>Together for a Season</i> Gill Ambrose (ed.) (Church House Publishing, 2006).</p>	<p>All-age seasonal resources for Advent, Christmas and Epiphany (with CD-Rom).</p> <p>Includes seasonal introduction, stand-alone services (including Christingle, Blue Christmas and New Year) as well as 3 ‘pathways’ to use throughout the whole period.</p>
	<p><i>Feasts & Festivals</i> Claire Benton-Evans (Kevin Mayhew, 2012)</p>	<p>All-age services for special occasions (with CD-Rom).</p> <p>Three sets of service materials for each of Christmas (A child is born; God’s glory; God is with us), Epiphany (Gold, frankincense and myrrh; Following the star; Gifts), and Candlemas (Meeting Jesus; Bitter-sweet; Festival of Light).</p>
	<p><i>Children Aloud!</i> Gordon and Ronni Lamont (Church House Publishing, 1997)</p>	<p>All-age resources: drama, prayers and meditations. Includes resources for Advent, Christmas, Epiphany and Candlemas.</p>

	<p>Celebrating Christingle Nick Fawcett (Kevin Mayhew, 2005)</p>	<p>“All you need to prepare a Christingle service...covering Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, offering a resource for all involved in preparing such an event, combining fun sketches and historical background with fully worked-out orders of service. Without sermonising, each gently explores the good news of God’s love in Christ.”</p>
	<p>The Christingle Cube Archbishop’s Council / The Children’s Society (2007)</p>	<p>“Allows people to learn more about Christingle in a fun and creative way, engaging with the Christian message in a unique and exciting format. This delightful, full-colour, ingenious cube is designed for those aged 3+ to be used during Christingle services or as a stand-alone resource.”</p>

Includes sketches, props, ideas and resources that could be used in any setting, not just with primary school classes.</p>
	<p>Christmas Make & Do Gillian Chapman (Barnabas, 2007)</p>	<p>An activity book of craft ideas explicitly linked to the Christmas story. Ideas include felt finger puppets; candle holder; shaped cookies; cardboard angels; Bethlehem advent calendar.</p>
	<p>Christmas Fun Deri Robins & Maggie Downer (Kingfisher, 1996)</p>	<p>An activity ideas book for things to make and do. Contents include: advent treat calendar; Christmas wreath and cards; decorating trees and windows’ nativity scene; cookbook; crafts and homemade presents. Feels a little old but still some classic ideas.</p>
	<p>The Wise Men Juliet David (Lion Hudson, 2009)</p>	<p>Board book. Bright images and simple sentences for babies and toddlers.</p>
	<p>Christmas Family Time Lucy Moore, et al (Bible Reading Fellowship, 2016)</p>	<p>Small activity book, primarily for giving away to families. “...aims to transfer the core values of Messy Church to the home and family context, encouraging families to talk together, be creative, be hospitable, be Christ-centred and celebratory, and including activities for all ages.</p>

Hannah Stout (10Publishing, 2018)</p>	<p>Storybook, with an accompanying Colouring Book. “Our story of Jesus began long ago, with Mary and Josph (but without the snow). Come hear the surprises that God had in story, to welcome his Son whom we all should adore.”</p>
	<p>Mary and the Angel Jesus is Born (Series 4 of Bibleworld Books, 2017)</p>	<p>Storybooks. Two storybooks adapted from American Mission Literacy books, which tell the story simply and with bold computer-generated images. It is also possible to download the stories on PowerPoint slides for free.</p>
	<p>A Christmas Story Brian Wildsmith (OUP, 2007)</p>	<p>Storybook. “Once, a long time ago, in a town called Nazareth, a little donkey was born... As the wonderful events of the Nativity unfold, Brian Wildsmith tells of the journey of a little girl and a donkey to Bethlehem.”</p>
	<p>The Sleepy Shepherd Stephen Cottrell, illust. Chris Hagan (SPCK, 2018)</p>	<p>Storybook. “The Sleepy Shepherd is so dozy he completely misses the visit of the angels...and the chance to greet the Christ-child in Bethlehem. 	<p><i>The First Christmas</i> Lois Rock, illust. Alex Ayliffe (Lion Hudson, 2011)</p>	<p>Storybook. Very small, useful for gifts, part of the "my very first Bible stories" series.</p>
	<p><i>Jesus is Born!</i> Dayspring USA</p>	<p>Children's Activity Book with 4 pages of stickers. Age 7-11 approx. Small booklet style with colouring and puzzles. UK outlets also sell these, although probably many more up-to-date ones available. Also have one that is out of print <i>The Story of Christmas</i>.</p>
