

GENERAL SYNOD MEMBERSHIP - CLERGY

The Revd Ryan Bennett

Ryan was born and grew up in Bendigo, Central Victoria, Australia. His family including Robert, Rosalie, Renee, Gerard and nephew Flynn are all still Victorian based, living on the Surf Coast, west of Melbourne. He was educated in Bendigo and upon completing Secondary education, moved to Melbourne and undertook a double B.A. & B.Theol degree program at Monash University and Trinity College, Melbourne respectively. Ordained in the Diocese of Ballarat in 2008, Ryan served in both Ballarat and Melbourne dioceses' before taking up the position as Bishop's Chaplain with Responsibility for Christ Church Cathedral, Ballarat followed by becoming Parish Priest of Springmount (Creswick, Clunes, Learmonth and Newlyn) in the goldfield's region of Central Victoria. During this period, Ryan served a term on both Bishop in Council as well as the Retired Homes Committee.

In January 2019, Ryan moved to New York with the Sponsorship of the Society of the Sacred Mission to undertake the MA *cum laude* and Master in Sacred Theology (S.T.M.) programs successively at the General Theological Seminary. He served as Assistant Priest of Saint Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue whilst living and also assisting at St. John in the Village Parish in Greenwich Village.

Ryan received scholarship support to undertake the PhD program in Practical Theology and Ethics at the University of Edinburgh School of Divinity (New College), moving to Edinburgh in January 2021. Ryan become the Locum Priest at Christ Church Morningside during the Interregnum (part-time) whilst studying full-time and living in the adjacent clergy house. He was appointed as Associate Rector of Christ Church, Morningside in October 2023. He enjoys life, study and ministry in Edinburgh and likes to explore Scotland, alongside reading, music, cooking and new gins!
