#### **New Diocesan Secretary**



Professor Wilson Poon will be the Diocese of Edinburgh's next Diocesan Secretary, the Bishop of Edinburgh has announced.

Wilson is a member of Old Saint Paul's Episcopal Church, Edinburgh, and Professor in the University of Edinburgh's School of Physics and Astronomy.

Having accepted on Thursday the Diocesan Standing Committee's invitation to take up the post, the decision will come to the autumn meeting of Diocesan Synod for ratification.

The Bishop of Edinburgh, The Rt Revd Dr John Armes, said: "I am pleased to announce that Professor Wilson Poon has accepted Standing Committee's invitation to be our next Diocesan Secretary. This decision will come to the autumn meeting of the Diocesan Synod for ratification.

"The primary duties of the Diocesan Secretary are set out in the Canons of the Scottish Episcopal Church. Each holder of the office also brings their own experience and gifts to the role and shapes it very differently. But the bottom line is that they are a key lay person in the diocese who works closely with bishop and dean as well as our various committees.

"I am very grateful that Wilson has been willing to undertake this new responsibility alongside his many other commitments."

Wilson added: "My reading of Scripture—for example, Exodus 18:13-17 and Acts 6:1-7—has long convinced me that appropriate organisation and administration are of deep spiritual significance for the people of God, and that these need to be renewed as needs and times change.

"I am therefore looking forward to serving in this role and playing my part in helping churches throughout the diocese to be the presence of Christ in today's world. I hope to have the opportunity to meet and get to know many of you over the coming months."

Please pray for Wilson as he works his way into this new role.

### <u>Janet McKinnell to step down</u> <u>as Warden of Lay Readers</u>

The Diocese's Warden of Lay Readers, Janet McKinnell, will step down after 15 years of service, the Bishop of Edinburgh has announced.

Janet, who is part of the congregation of Holy Trinity, Haddington, East Lothian, will bring her tenure to a close at the end of July.

The Bishop of Edinburgh, The Rt Revd Dr John Armes, said: "I am so grateful to Janet for her 15 years of service in this role, for her diligence in pastoral care and in promoting Lay Reader ministry within the diocese and the province.

"I have always found her advice and support invaluable. Lay Readers offer an often unseen yet vital contribution to ministry in many of our charges.

"Thank you, Janet, we wish you well as you explore where your ministry will next take you."

Lay Readers play a pivotal function in the Diocese of Edinburgh and wider Scottish Episcopal Church, assisting priests with pastoral work, outreach, preaching, teaching and spiritual development. They are not normally paid a stipend.

Alan Baker has been appointed as the new Warden for Lay Readers, and will soon take up formally the position.

The Bishop of Edinburgh commented: "I am delighted to announce that Alan Baker has accepted my invitation to be our new Warden of Lay Readers.

"Alan is Lay Reader at St Ninian's, Comely Bank, having begun his ministry in the Church of England."

Alan Baker added: "I am honoured to take on the role of Warden of Lay Readers and I hope that I can fulfil it diligently and compassionately.

"Lay Readers have a great deal to offer and I look forward to working with them, so their gifts may find full expression in the communities they serve, and beyond."

Please hold Alan in your prayers as he works with Janet over the coming months to enable a smooth transition.





"I was very moved to hear of the Bishop of Chelmsford's recent visit to the Holy Land. The Rt Revd Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani has long expérience of that part of the world. +Guli's interview with Francis Martin from the Church Times puts the present crisis in helpful context.

+Guli speaks of the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre which the Diocese of Edinburgh supported in our Lent Appeal, and of the plight of Palestinians presently in Israeli gaols.

I would commend her insights and agree with her that we must see an immediate ceasefire, the release of hostages and borders open to allow aid to relieve the immense suffering in Gaza.
