John Stuart made Lay Canon at St Mary's Cathedral



John Stuart, who will step down as Secretary General of the General Synod of the Scottish Episcopal Church at the end of July following 28 years of service, was installed by The Bishop of Edinburgh, The Rt Revd Dr John Armes, as an Honorary Lay Canon at St Mary's Cathedral in Edinburgh on Sunday afternoon.

+John paid warm tribute to John during Evensong, presenting him with a badge worn by Canons in the Edinburgh Diocese and a deed of installation.

A short reception in the Cathedral's Resurrection Chapel was attended by family, friends and colleagues from around the Province after the service of celebration, which took place during Choral Evensong.

John was installed as a Lay Canon after our Diocesan Synod agreed in February to honour him in this way.

Bishop John said: "John has never sought the limelight. He seems to understand innately Jesus' teaching that greatness comes through service.

"But now, as he prepares to step back from his long and faithful service to the church, we wanted, in our small way, to recognise and to applaud all that he has given the Scottish Episcopal Church by installing him as an Honorary Lay Canon of St Mary's Cathedral."

Instead of receiving a personal gift, John Stuart has said that anyone who would like to mark his tenure is welcome to make a donation to the Scottish Episcopal Institute Training Fund. 
