

The Net Zero Portal funding page includes:

Building Grants Fund...now including Net Zero funds

- Fund for general building projects and those focused on reducing carbon.
- Grants up to 50% of total cost of works.
- Building must be wholly church owned
- Diocese must support applications.

- Buildings Grant Group allocate both large and small grants
- Net Zero team must review all applications
- Consult with Net Zero team if works are related to reducing carbon

Building Loans Fund

- Loans available for reducing carbon in any church building.
- Loans available for five years maximum.
- Fixed interest rate of 5%
- Short-term bridging loans will be considered
- This can help get projects started while awaiting receipt of external grants

Diocesan funding may also be available.

Rectory Green Fund – The Small Print

The Rectory Green Fund provides financial assistance to charges undertaking works to clergy housing to improve their energy efficiency and reduce carbon footprint. Rectories should be at an EPC of C and funds can be used to improve EPC to reach or exceed this level.

Grants for up to £5,000 are available for such works. Any grants provided by the fund must be matched by diocesan grants.

Any application must be endorsed by a member of the provincial Net Zero team before moving forward to the Building Grants Group. Start off by contacting your Diocesan contact within the Net Zero team.

Any works designed to improve energy efficiency or reduce a property's carbon footprint will be considered – in cases where costs exceed the combined rectory green fund grant / diocesan grant they will be also eligible for grant support from the Building Grants Fund – total provincial grant funding will not normally exceed 50% of costs.

Examples of what this fund could be used for:

- Insulation
- Replacement windows and doors
- •Energy efficiency heating system (air source / ground source heat pumps)
- Solar panels
- Radiant heat







Renewable Energy Measures

- Heat pumps
- Solar panels
- Infrared Heaters
- Conversion of heat sources (gas to electric)
- Turbines



Energy Efficiency Measures

- Insulation
- Double-glazing or new windows/doors
- Boiler cladding
- Draught-proofing






External Funding Tips

- 1. Do your research!
- 2. Make applications personal and community-focused
- 3. Know the funding guidance inside-out
- 4. Ask for help from the Net Zero team
- 5. Learn from feedback and persevere

Application Support



- Application processes can take months before funding is awarded
- Keep tradespeople informed during this process
- Funding options and deadlines can change keep an eye on the Net Zero Portal funding page for up-to-date information
- Consider the long-term financial benefits of your project
